Your glass-bottled water is mains filtered, to avoid buying in plastic bottles.

We are carrying out a phased upgrade of our lighting, and installing a state-of-the-art Building Energy Management System (utilising the latest technology to control and monitor heating, ventilation and related systems for maximum energy efficiencies). 


The Robertson Suite

Named after David Robertson (1806–1896), the Scottish geologist known as 'The Cumbrae Naturalist', who persuaded the business community in Glasgow to commit to a permanent marine research station at Millport. The Robertson Suite is bathed in natural light, with expansive coastal views, and is the ideal location for large meetings, networking events or training.

How to get to us

SAMS is located in the village of Dunbeg on the A85, under 3 miles from Oban, and has free parking on site. Citylink buses 975 and 900 connect Oban to Glasgow and Edinburgh, with a bus stop at Dunbeg Road End - a 15-minute walk from SAMS. If you're travelling to us by train along the breathtaking West Highland Line, there are several local taxi operators that collect from Oban Railway Station.

Where to stay

From boutique guest houses and 5* hotels to self-catering, cottages, Oban has accommodation for every budget. As an attractive tourist town and gateway to the Isles, rooms get booked up quickly so enquire directly with your preferred option well in advance. Independent B&Bs / hotels. What to do

A small selection of what our amazing location has to offer...

McCaig's Tower

This prominent tower is one of Oban's best-known features. Commissioned by wealthy banker John Stuart McCaig the tower was erected between 1897 and McCaig's death in 1902. The unfinished empty shell dominates the skyline, and is now a public garden with magnificent far-reaching views to the islands of Kerrera, Lismore and Mull – well worth the 144 steps of Jacob's Ladder!

Dunollie Castle

The ancestral home of the MacDougall clan, there has been evidence of human settlement in Dunollie for over 8000 years! The castle ruins date from 15th Century and it was abandoned in 1746

when Dunollie House (now a museum) was built. Enjoy daily activities throughout the year.

Wildlife tours

Oban's sheltered location on the west coast attracts a diverse wildlife population and there are several companies offering excursions, walks and tours. Book directly with the operators and start ticking off your UK wildlife bucket-list – keep your eyes peeled for pine marten, deer and white-tailed eagles!

Distillery & Brewery tours

Oban's Distillery is older than Oban itself! Limited in size by the town that sprung up around it, just seven people

make every drop of Oban's 14-year-old classic malt. Book a tour or a tasting experience and discover the distillery's remarkable story.

Boat trips & outdoor adventures

Argyll's spectacular land and seascapes offer the perfect environment for outdoor activities; from a peaceful paddle to Kerrera to a day's hike up one of the 20 Munros in the local area - Oban's friendly local outdoor specialists can recommend activities to suit your interests and capability. Be amazed and inspired by the science behind our oceans


